Parish Members Prepare for Lenten Healing Mission

Our parishioners are now preparing for our Lenten Healing Mission, which will take place March 12, 13 and 14. They are preparing by committing to say each day the "Prayer for Healing". Prayer cards were distributed at Masses last weekend and will continue to be available at Church. The card has space for parishioners to list the names or initials of those they are praying for.

You are asked to think about people you know who are in need of some sort of healing. It could be a physical healing, for instance after surgery or an accident. Others you know might be seeking better emotional or mental health. Still others could be in need of a healing of relationships. Among these are those who need a healthier relationship with God, in other words some sort of spiritual healing. Others again might be in need of better financial health.

The weeks between now and March 12 are a time of prayer in preparation for the Healing Mission. Our retreat master is Father Richard ("Duke") Zajac, who has been chaplain at Sisters Hospital for 35 years. Three things you need to know about Father Duke:

- No priest in our diocese knows more about praying for healing.
- ♦ No priest in our diocese spends more time preparing homilies. Typically he spends 12 hours preparing a 12 minute talk.
- ♦ He has published four volumes of his homilies and sermons, under the title "Healing Injections".

Services will take place at 12:00noon and 7:00pm each day of the Retreat. Services include celebration of the Eucharist with a homily on a healing theme. After Mass, participants come forward to be prayed over by a priest or deacon. At this time the Sacrament of Penance, or Reconciliation, is available as well.

Please pray over the next month or so to better prepare for the Healing Mission. Be sure to take more Healing Prayer cards to pass along to those that may be in need of prayers.

Cuomo to Re-Introduce Abortion Expansion-On January 16, Governor Cuomo introduced his budget bill, S.7511. In the bill, he included a version of the "Reproductive Health Act" (RHA)

abortion expansion proposal.

In 2013, Governor Andrew Cuomo included the RHA as one part of a 10-point "Women's Equality Act (WEA)." Although the WEA passed the Assembly, the Senate refused to vote on abortion expansion, and the bill was not enacted into law.

Including the RHA in the budget is particularly dangerous for unborn children. The only way to remove an item from the Governor's proposed budget bill is to put it on the table for negotiations between him and the leaders of the Assembly and Senate. Since three of those people are ardently "pro-choice," removing the RHA will be a very difficult task. Because by law a budget must be passed by April 1, the leaders will be under pressure to capitulate to meet the deadline.

The Governor's bill is a radical proposal that would give New York the most liberal abortion laws in the world -- in fact, it would remove any limitations on abortion from our laws. It would:

- Encourage more late-term abortions by removing our current law's limit on abortions after 24 weeks.
- Permit non-doctors to do abortions.
- Eliminate all criminal penalties for abortions so even if an abortion was involuntary or coerced, it could not be prosecuted.
- Endanger children after birth by eliminating a law
 that requires that a baby born alive after an abortion be
 given adequate health care. Instead, this bill would allow abortionists to leave those children to die of neglect and starvation.

<u>PLEASE</u> contact your State Senator and urge them to oppose the budget bill if the abortion expansion proposal is in it. Go to the Action Center of the New York State Catholic Conference (www.nyscatholic.org).


