

ADVENT MES-SAGE FROM FR. PAUL

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

We have just entered into the holy time of Advent. As we light the first violet candle in the Advent wreath, I'm sure that there is a lot on our minds.

'Prepare' would be the operative word. There are so many things that we are preparing: We

are preparing for the busy-ness of the Christmas season; we are preparing the house with lights, Christmas tree and ornaments; we are preparing gifts for all those whom we love; we are preparing to entertain all the guests coming over; we are preparing all the delicious Christmas food; and we are preparing for the wonder of the newborn Savior in the manger, Jesus who loved us so much He became one of us.

This Advent season is all about preparation as well! Certainly, we are preparing to worthily celebrate the anniversary of the Lord's coming into the world as the incarnate God of love on Christmas day. But we are also preparing to make ourselves ready for Jesus to come again in victory at the end of time. During Advent, all of our Scriptural readings and music during Mass reflect that God will come again and that we have to have our eyes focused on the promises of an eternal life of joy with our Heavenly Father.

Just as we prepare our families and house for the Christmas season, so we must also prepare our souls for the coming of Christ. This should not fill us with fear or anxiety about the future, but should fill us with hope. The Church sings in the Advent season, "Maranatha! Come Lord Jesus!" or "O come, O come Emmanuel!

Your Lord is near *Emmanuel*!" We wait in joyful hope and expectation for the coming of our Lord Jesus when He comes in glory.


During Advent, the priest and the deacon wear violet vestments which stand for penitence. Although it is not of the same caliber as Lenten penitence, this season of Advent calls us to look deeply into our own souls and ask the Lord where we need to change, convert, repent and become more the image and likeness of God that He wants us to be. This means that we should be fasting and almsgiving, giving of ourselves to others, and becoming more selfless.

This may seem like a tall order. "Forgive me if what follows is a bit trite, but I'm just overcome with the spirit of the season!) I am reminded of Charles Dicken's classic "A Christmas Carol." Towards the end of the story, Ebenezer Scrooge is overwhelmed with despair because he had seen how he had lived his life selfishly. As the ghost of Christmas yet to come shows him his own headstone, Ebenezer exclaims, "Oh, tell me I may sponge away the writing on that stone!" Thankfully, we all know how the story ends! But this part does offer a good lesson for all of us during this Advent season: that we need to prepare for Christ who will come again. We do that by allowing God to mold us and change our hearts to be more like His and, as Ebenzer Scrooge learned, to be less selfish and more giving because that is what gives true happiness.

May you all have a blessed Advent season as you prepare for the coming of Christ as a newborn baby at Christmas time and also when He comes again in glory. Come Lord Jesus! Amen.


